New Features Launch in OnePhilly

By **OnePhilly** and the **Office of Human Resources**

Two new features are now live in OnePhilly: **Total Compensation Statements** and **Preferred Name Selection**. Total Compensation gives you a view of the explicit monetary value of your earnings and benefits as a City employee, while Preferred Name lets you update how your name appears in the OnePhilly Self-Service system.

These tools are part of our ongoing efforts to improve transparency, inclusivity, and access for all City employees. We can't wait for you to try these new features for yourself starting today.

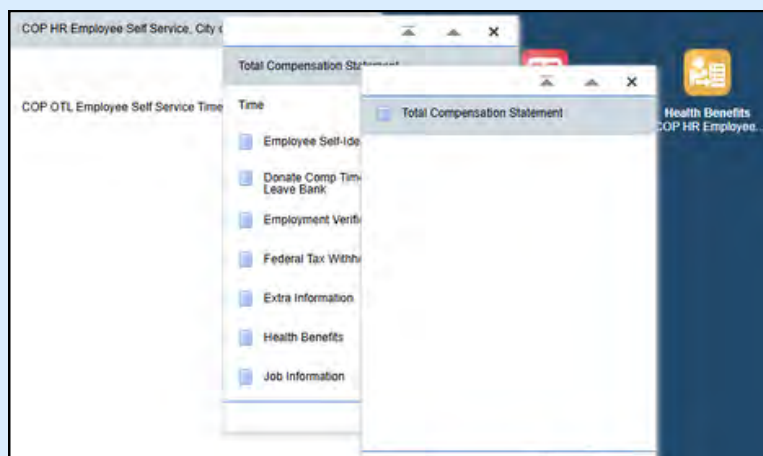


To access your Total Compensation Statement:

1. Log in to your OnePhilly account
2. Click the three horizontal white lines (Navigator button) next to **ORACLE E-Business Suite**

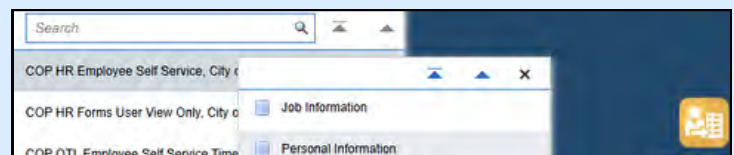


3. Click **COP HR Employee Self-Service, City of Philadelphia**
4. Click **Total Compensation Statement**
5. Open your Total Compensation Statement



To designate a Preferred Name:

1. Follow steps 1-3 for accessing Total Compensation Statement
2. Scroll down and click **Personal Information**



3. Click **Update** on the right side of **Basic Details**
4. Choose the 'Enter new information' option and click **Next**
5. Enter your preferred name

Celebrating **Creative Philadelphia**

The Creative Philadelphia Art Gallery has officially reopened its doors following renovations—and it's more than just a fresh coat of paint. Located in Room 116 of City Hall, the gallery is once again welcoming the public to explore artwork by local Philadelphia artists, especially those who may not otherwise have access to a public space to showcase their work.

The reopening also marks the 15th anniversary of the gallery's original debut in 2010. With updated flooring, added storage, and improved exhibition and office spaces, the Creative Philadelphia team is ready to continue its mission of elevating creativity throughout the city.

The gallery is a hidden gem in the heart of City Hall, open Monday through Thursday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., and Fridays from 12 to 4 p.m. It's the perfect place for City employees to take a lunch break, enjoy some creative inspiration, or stop in to meet the Creative Philadelphia team. Visitors should enter through the Northeast Corner Visitor's Entrance.

The first exhibition in the renovated space, *Made and Remade – the Art of the Philadelphia Dumpster Divers*, featured 15 artists who transform everyday discarded objects into imaginative works of art. City employees were invited to visit the new space and experienced the exhibit at the Gallery Open House on June 4.
